Oranging' the Library

During a ceremony held at the Kosovo Library, Pjeter Bogdani marked the start of the campaign by lighting the library in orange and calling for a brighter future for women and girls. The annual 'oranging' of the National Public Library was marked by several inspiring speeches.

As this year's campaign sought to convey a powerful and compelling message – to 'end violence against women now!' – the host of the ceremony, the Head of UN Women in Kosovo, emphasised that the best cure to gender-based violence

The Kosovo Assembly joined the '16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence' campaign

Members of the Assembly of Kosovo wore orange shawls and other orange symbols in support of the campaign, helping raise awareness of the need to eliminate gender-based violence. The Speaker of the Assembly of Kosovo called for continued solidarity and continuous efforts, and actions to prevent violence against women, as well as to preserve and protect their dignity.

UNDP marked the #OrangeTheWorld campaign by oranging important cultural heritage sites in cooperation with the shelters and inter-institutional coordination mechanism against domestic and gender-based violence in these municipalities to call for the end of gender-based violence.

Every year, for 16 days starting on 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and continuing through 10 December, is education: 'While there is no vaccine against gender-based violence, it is in our hands to prevent it. And the best prevention is education.' The Minister of Education reiterated this point, noting that gender-based violence can only be fought by educating young generations and by fostering a culture of equality starting with children: 'Preventing violence begins with education, formal and informal. It is our common duty to educate future generations free of harmful gender norms, so women and girls will have a better future. We must engage men and boys, to become protectors of the rights of women and girls!'

Diellza Hoti, the daughter of Armenda

Aliu who was killed by her husband in August 2019, called on relevant institutions to prioritise gender-based violence and called on society to support and empower women. 'Aware of the importance of this global campaign against violence against women, so that tomorrow there will be no more victims, I am among you today. I call on, men and women, boys and girls, let us take advantage of these 16 days of activism against gender-based violence, and further, to raise their voices, report violence, and together end violence against women and girls, today and forever.'

Human Rights Day, the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence campaign is a time to encourage action to end violence against women and girls around the world. Kosovo has been part of the global campaign for several years through the multi-stakeholder Security and Gender Group (SGG) chaired by UN Women.

A key aspect of this year's campaign is to work with the private sector. Around 20 private companies and corporations joined this year's campaign, raising awareness among their staff and customers on the role of the private sector in preventing gender-based violence. In addition, to address harmful gender norms and stereotypes, shift social norms and raise public awareness on the need to eliminate violence against women, these companies developed products with campaign insignia, and published campaign material on their social media. These companies and corporations have committed to embed gender equality across workplace cultures, policies, and practices with a significant impact on both the business and community. To mark this joint activity with the private sector, UN Women, together with Abi Çarshia, Cinemarine, organized a ceremony and a special Hive film screening. The event gathered the private sector, civil society and Domestic Violence Coordination Mechanisms representatives. The special guest of the night, Fahrije Hoti, the real-life heroine on whose life the film, Hive, was based, oranged ABI Çarshia and called for increased efforts to prevent violence against women.





16 Days Campaign launched with activities calling for the urgent elimination of violence against women

The international campaign, '16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence', began on 25 November. Led by UN Women, in coordination with and supported by UN agencies, local and international partners, the campaign was launched under the global theme, 'Orange the World: End Violence against Women Now!' Several activities were organized, underlining the urgent need to eliminate violence against women with the colour orange selected to symbolise a brighter future, free of violence.

This user-friendly platform is available in Albanian and Serbian and has multiple options and channels through which women can communicate with KLI lawyers and easier access their rights. Speaking during the event, the UN Development Coordinator described the benefits of this platform: 'Through this platform, women and girls will know their rights and have the tool to claim them.

Support the training of ministerial legal officers on the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities

With OHCHR and UNMIK's support and in collaboration with the Government's Office of Good Governance. Human Rights, Equal Opportunities, and Non-discrimination, the NGO HandiKOS organized a two-day capacity-building workshop for legal officers and a representative of the Ombudsperson Institution on the principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD), its implementation in Kosovo, and engagement with relevant UN human rights mechanisms, including the UN Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and the Special Procedures of the UN Human Rights Council, in particular the mandate of the Special Rapporteur on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

The training falls within the framework of a current OHCHR and UNMIK initiative that also includes, among other things, advocacy for the inclusion of the CRPD into the list of directly applicable international and regional human rights instruments in Kosovo's constitution.

Marking the World Children's Day

The Kosovo Philharmonic Orchestra performs Vivaldi's 'Four Seasons' reimagined with climate data

Kosovo Philharmonic joined UNDP's call for #ClimateAction in a powerful performance of Antonio Vivaldi's 'Four Seasons', adapted using 300 years of climate data. The musical score, recomposed using a specially programmed algorithm and originally performed by Elbphilharmonie Hamburg, was performed for the second time ever by the Kosovo Philharmonic orchestra. Climate data sets from 1725 were used to build an algorithm which was then adapted to Four Seasons. Representing nearly 300 years of global CO2 emissions, the higher the CO2 value the longer the note was held. Since CO2 emissions are constantly growing, the last Season, Winter, becomes increasingly violent and intense. The Orchestra reflected these changes in the Four Seasons with the hope that people would hear and appreciate the message being conveyed across the world as a plea to help the earth.

UNDP's Public Pulse Analysis: People-Municipality Interaction in Times of Crisis: A COVID-19 Case Study

UNDP launched the Public Pulse Analysis 'People-Municipality Interaction in Times of Crisis: A COVID-19 Case Study in a virtual presentation of key findings. The survey, which was conducted in five municipalities. Fushë Kosovë/Kosovo Polie, Podujevë/Podujevo, Prizren, Rahovec/Orahovac, and Zvecan/ Zvečan, highlights the challenges these municipalities have experienced during the pandemic and people's satisfaction with the support and communication received, as well as public service provision and the availability of resources in the context of the pandemic. The Public Pulse Analysis is based on research which included 500 survey interviews conducted in March 2021 and nine focus group discussions held from April to June 2021. The MoU also foresees that other interested CSOs working in the field of human rights in Kosovo may apply and join as members of the broader human rights network.

Local human rights CSOs kicked off the drafting of their third annual joint human rights report with support from OHCHR and UNMIK

A coalition of grassroots human rights CSOs convened to kick off the drafting of their third annual joint report on the human rights situation in Kosovo in 2021 with support from OHCHR and UNMIK.

The publication is expected in the first quarter of 2022. The first and second annual joint civil society human rights reports for 2019 and 2020, respectively, which were also produced with support from OHCHR and UNMIK, filled an important human rights monitoring and reporting gap in Kosovo and provided a solid basis allowing civil society to advocate jointly with a unified voice to advance the realisation of human rights for all communities in Kosovo.

As acknowledged by OHCHR and the contributing grassroots human rights CSOs, the overall process and the production of these ground-breaking reports have enhanced civic space and advanced human rights for all in Kosovo.

Sub-regional training on 'Risk Analysis in the Response to Food Safety Emergencies'

A sub-regional training in the Western Balkans took place in Durres, Albania, 25–26 November 2021. The training was organized by the WHO Regional Office for Europe in support of the WHO Office in Albania.

The overall purpose of the training was to support Western Balkan countries to strengthen their core capacities for food safety as defined under the IHR (2005) by operationally applying risk analysis principles and procedures in response to food safety emergencies using a One Health approach.

Online course on Air Pollution and Health

Three participants from the Institute of Public Health and Kosovo Environmental Protection Agency attended the four-week online course on air pollution and health organized by the WHO European Centre for Environment and Health (ECEH) in Bonn. The objectives of the course were to address technical gaps and raise awareness on environmental health, increase knowledge exchange and collaboration, and support evidencebased decision-making. Continuation of assistance in response to COVID-19

USAID announced USD 2.5 million assistance in prevention and response to COVID-19 in Kosovo. This amount is in addition to more than USD 2.6 million in COVID-19 assistance to Kosovo through USAID during the pandemic.

Mobile clinics to offer services to vulnerable people

Two mobile clinics were handed over to the Mother Teresa Society and Handikos Gjilan/Gnjilane to provide specialized, needed services to persons in need. Mobile clinics consist of customised vehicles that will travel to communities throughout Kosovo to provide services based on needs. The support will focus primarily on #PersonsWithDisabilities and the #Elderly living in remote areas.
