25 November The International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women marks the launch of the '16 days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence & campaign. This year, in Kosovo¹, the launch of the 16 Day Campaign was marked by a joint EU-UN and the Mayor of Gjakova (Đakovica). The delegation of EU Special Representative, UN Development Coordinator, UN Women, UNDP, IOM and the Mayor jointly visited the "Safe House" shelter for survivors of domestic violence and the bakery owned by the shelter, during which the importance of support for the survivors was emphasized, especially now during COVID-19, when their economic empowerment is at a high risk. Next, was a visit to IOM's beneficiary, a young tailor from the Egyptian community who operates a store in the Old Bazaar of Gjakova/Đakovica. With a grant she received from the EU Community Stabilization Programme III, an EU-funded program, implemented by IOM, she managed to expand her existing business which her father established in 2012 and increase the quality and quantity of her clothes production, using various types of fabrics. The visit finalized at the Terzi and Tabak Bridges, which were lit in orange by EU and UNDP, to mark the first day of the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-based Violence campaign. 27 November UNHCR supported development of the new website which includes updated information on COVID-19 and the latest statistics of the Institute of Public Health, as well as informs asylum seekers about the asylum system in Kosovo, information about provision of assistance and prospects of integration. The website is developed as part of the EU funded project by the Service for Foreign Policy Instruments "Addressing COVID-19 Challenges within the Migrant and Refugee Response in the Western Balkans" implemented by IOM and UNHCR. The content also includes guidelines and measures taken by institutions in Kosovo on prevention from COVID-19. This platform is managed by Civil Rights Program - Kosovo (CRP/K). LINK

30 November UNICEF in partnership with Ministry of Health, provided 165,000 doses of seasonal influenza vaccine, which is 60 % more than previous years for Kosovo. 120.500 doses are delivered, while 40.000 are to be delivered in the weeks to come. UNICEF provides high quality and cheaper vaccines for many countries and territories from manufacturers pre-qualified by the World Health Organization. LINK

25 November UNDP and the EU organised the lighting in orange of the Terzi and Tabak Bridges on the occasion of 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence. The lightening of iconic buildings around the world in orange is a key part of the "16 Days of Activism" Campaign. Orange colour symbolizes a bright future without violence against women and girls. On November 25 th , throughout Kosovo, many buildings and cultural heritage monuments were lit up in orange, including the Assembly Building, Ministry of Justice, Cathedral in Pristina, European Union Office Building, the Bill Clinton Street and more. Kosovo is a part of the global "16 Days of Activism" campaign for several years now through the UN Women Office in Kosovo, which co-ordinates the campaign through the multi-stakeholder Security and Gender Group (SGG).

Community Outreach and Assistance Delivery

12 November UNFPA Kosovo delivered to the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare nearly 40,000 items of personal protective equipment PPE. The equipment will protect 350 health care providers and support staff working in institutions elderly care, as well as 270 elderly and people with disabilities living in them. This amount of equipment is sufficient for the next 3-4 months. UNFPA delivered 25 laptops to the Centres for Social Work, in order to support social workers in response to Gender-Based Violence - GBV, enable easier management of these cases and support the shelters. LINK

16 – 27 November IOM is distributing 475 m 3 of firewood to 95 vulnerable families – beneficiaries of the EU Return and Reintegration in Kosovo phase V (EU-RRK V) project, implemented by IOM, funded by the EU Office in Kosovo, co-financed by the Ministry of Communities. The assistance is part of the Harmonized Assistance Packages (HAP) to beneficiaries. A total of 488 family members in 11 municipalities will receive 5 m3 of much needed firewood per family. LINK



17 November IOM helped seven displaced families from Kosovo-Serbian community to return to their place of origin in Kosovo, respectively in Istog/k municipality after years of displacement in Serbia through the assistance provided by the EU-Return and Reintegration Programme in Kosovo phase V (EU-RRK-V).Reintegration into Kosovo society after years of displacement is a challenging process. Thus, to further alleviate this process, these families are initially assisted with food, non-food and firewood items as well as income generation assistance. The EU-RRK – V, is an EU funded Programme, co-funded by the Ministry of Communities and Returns, and implemented by International Organization for Migration (IOM) which supports the return and reintegration process for displaced persons in 12 Kosovo municipalities.

24 November UNDP, through ALMP project, in cooperation with the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare, handed over much-needed packages of equipment to jobseekers allowing them to start their own businesses. These beneficiaries are among 136 repatriated jobseekers in Kosovo supported this year.

24 November Let's do it Kosova and Kosovo Olympic Committee launched a 10-year long campaign on planting 1.8 million trees in Kosovo. UN Development Coordinator stressed that the UN Kosovo will support the campaign as it corresponds with the Decade of Action of Agenda 2030. Together with the rector of University of Pristina, famous judoka Olympic gold medallist from Kosovo, Ms. Majlinda Kelmendi, Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Rural Revelopment and others, we planted 18 symbolic trees near the Rectorate of University of Pristina.

25 November UNDP and UNV supported Kosovo Assembly with digital tools, to ensure secure and reliable virtual meetings and initiatives, so the Assembly can continue its legislative mandate in any conditions. This contribution is part of the UNDP/UNV "Support Kosovo Institutions with swift and innovative solutions to contain the spread of COVID-19 pandemic" project funded by the Multi-Partner Trust Fund (MPTF). November WHO Pristina continued to support IPH to transition to the Go.Data platform by donating 8 laptops and 1 server to IPH. Go.Data is a tool for monitoring, collecting, and analysing COVID-19 data in a more efficient way.

20 November UNDP's Kosovo Safety and Security Programme (KSSP), through the 'Support to Countering Illicit Arms Trafficking – Border (CIAT)' project supported the border police by upgrading its technical capacities with five new state-of-the-art endoscopes. The endoscopes will further increase the efficiency and effectiveness of border police officers in detecting illicit arms trafficking, ammunition and explosives, and increase the confiscation levels. The project is funded by the government of the Federal Republic of Germany. LINK

30 November UNFPA Kosovo in cooperation with Red Cross supported 275 elderly people with food, hygienic items, medication, clothing, and psychosocial support. LINK
